Cafe news

Over the past few months, 'Flourish', our training café, has continued to go from strength to strength. The recent addition of our Guernsey Dairy Ice Cream stand has been a fantastic success, creating new opportunities for customer interaction and providing the Crew with valuable new skills.

Customers can now enjoy four delicious flavours, Mint Choc Chip, Vanilla, Strawberry, and Chocolate, served in either a cone or a tub.

July was our busiest month ever, with more than 600 hot drinks and nearly 400 meals served, firmly establishing 'Flourish' as a favourite spot for our community.

At the heart of what we do is providing the Crew with meaningful workplace training, but in an environment that is quite different from traditional employment. We focus on building confidence, developing social skills, and encouraging teamwork. So far this year, the café has delivered over 2,400 hours of training in both the kitchen and front of house, an achievement we are truly proud of.

Preparing for our orchard

During July a dedicated group of 13 volunteers from the Office of the Data Protection Authority joined the Grow team and Crew on site to help clear the raised beds and begin preparations for a new orchard of fruit trees. Each lantern is designed to last for many Halloweens to come, offering a reusable and eco-friendly alternative to single-use decorations.

The process is hands-on and full of care: the team sketch out unique pumpkin faces, then carefully relief cut each design so no two lanterns are ever the same. Once the carving is complete, the lanterns are scorched, sanded back, and finished with a warm orange stain that makes them glow with festive charm.

Perfect with an LED candle inside, these lanterns are safe, stylish, and a wonderful way to bring Halloween spirit into your home. By choosing one, you're not only supporting sustainable craft but also the amazing work of our workshop crew.

I joined Grow in 2023, just before the 40th anniversary, and from day one I felt warmly welcomed by the Crew and staff. It was a little daunting at first, but I quickly knew I'd found a good place to be. Growing up, I was surrounded by plants – my father had vineries and I spent many hours helping with odd jobs in horticulture.

Later, I moved to England to study engineering, but within a year my path changed completely when I began DJing. What started as a sideline turned into a 20-year career in nightclubs from 1989 to 2009. When I returned to Guernsey, I worked for Guernsey Clematis for 13 years before joining Grow.

Now, as a supervisor, I manage the main vinery, making sure the plants are nurtured and kept in the best condition possible, which has been particularly challenging during this hot summer.

It's rewarding working with new varieties beyond roses and clematis. Most of all I value working alongside the Crew and being part of the team – it's fulfilling, rewarding, and I'm genuinely happy here.

'I have been making stained glass items as a hobby for 20 plus years. Along with two of my daughters, Samantha and Charlotte, we make up the 'Glassy Birds'.

We try to cater at Grow for the garden with glass plant stakes and vegetable sticks for the green fingered and glass succulents for the not so green fingered (you can't kill them!).

I also enjoy volunteering in the Grow shop once a week. It is a chance to give my time to the charity. It is great meeting the Crew and staff and seeing how happy everyone is. I often take the chance to go into the café for lunch or a coffee.
